Not Where We Want to Be

A message from WPF President, Ashley Madden

Greetings to all of my WPF Sisters! I'm writing you here at the end of July in a last-minute revision of my President's Message. Two weeks ago, I wrote the newsletter I have been waiting to write all year. You know, the one where I tell you how excited I am to finally be back in



person at Starmount for our monthly lunch meetings. But that is not the article you are reading from me now. The one you are reading now is the one where I am telling you how sad I am, how absolutely frustrated I am, that I decided yesterday, with full support from the WPF Board of Directors, that we are not ready to safely gather in person at this time. The Board will continue to monitor all factors carefully to determine future meeting format beyond August.

As I watched the Covid daily case count dramatically increase over the past two weeks, I have been increasingly more concerned. The new case count for NC was 540 on July 13th. On July 29th, it was over 3,000. Hospitalizations for our state have doubled from 500 to over 1,000 in the same time period. This week, Pfizer released an update that the vaccine loses effectiveness by about 6% every two months after administration, slipping to around 84% after six months. So, even for our vaccinated members, with cases rising dramatically in our community, the risks are just too high for us to hold an indoor lunch meeting at this time.

I begrudgingly pulled my masks out of the closet this morning and put them back in my car for indoor situations, even though I have been vaccinated for months. I am grateful for the protection the vaccine provides me, even if it is declining over time. If and when we have booster vaccines, I will gladly get the shot when it's made available to me. We have to accept the reality that Covid is part of the fabric of our lives for the foreseeable future, changing how we navigate the world. I'm not trying to be all doom and gloom. I'm a "glass half full" and "turn lemons into lemonade" kind of girl, y'all! But I also believe in science and being pragmatic and taking the initiative to pivot when necessary. As Glennon Doyle says, "we can do hard things".

So, I look forward to seeing you all at the August meeting on Zoom. Suzanne Elise Walsh, President of Bennett College will be our featured speaker this month. She has an amazing background which you can read more about below. I'm also excited for the four-minute special from our own Tameika Howell. Whether you know Tameika or not, you are in for a treat!! And of course, we will have a fun and thoughtful Connection Room question to kick off the Zoom meeting.

Ms. Walsh earned a bachelor's degree in social work from Cornell University, as well as a master's degree in social work and a law degree from Case Western Reserve University. She is a member of the Ohio bar.






A note from Jean Pudlo, WPFF President
