October Is National Disability Employment Awareness Month

October 2025 marks the 80th anniversary of <u>National Disability Employment Awareness Month</u>, or "NDEAM," an annual recognition of the contributions and strengths that workers with disabilities bring to U.S. workplaces and the economy.

NDEAM traces its origins to Public Law 176, which was enacted by Congress in 1945 and declared the first week in October as National Employ the Physically Handicapped Week. In 1962, the word "physically" was dropped to acknowledge the employment needs and contributions of individuals with all nature of disabilities. In 1988, Congress designated the commemoration as National Disability Employment Awareness Month. Since that time, NDEAM has evolved to acknowledge the importance of increasing workforce opportunities for people with disabilities, including those with mental health conditions and other nonvisible disabilities.

In 2001, the U.S. Department of Labor created the <u>Office of Disability Employment Policy</u> (ODEP) to administer NDEAM, including the selection and promotion of its theme each year.

In 2025, through this year's official theme, "Celebrating Value and Talent," NDEAM will acknowledge the value and talents that American workers with disabilities add to our workplaces and economy and highlight their past and present achievements.
